Zhong Nanshan, an 83-year-old doctor who became famous 17 years ago for “daring to speak” in the fight against SARS, is the public face of China’s effort 28 (control) a new kind of coronavirus(冠状病毒).

Despite his advanced age, Zhong 29 (appoint) to take the lead to look into and study the new virus after it broke out. Its outbreak was 30 (shock) news for millions of Chinese people who were traveling for the week-long Lunar New Year holiday.
